

At miniroundabout take second exit and continue up the hill on A346. At next miniroundabout take second exit to continue uphill on the A346, signposted Burbage A346, Salisbury A338. Drive through Cadley and about 2.7 miles after the miniroundabout take turning on right signposted Wootton Rivers, Brimslade. Drive for 0.5 miles until you see a brick abutment. Immediately after this, park on right in layby, being careful not to block Mud Lane bridleway. Access to reserve is by steep steps on right from bridleway.
