

Nadder Island

Salisbury 0.6 hectares

This crescent-shaped wooded island in the River Nadder can be viewed from the river bank, but there is no public access. Although next to an industrial estate the island is peaceful.

Only 22 metres at its widest and 380 metres long, few have ever set foot on it to disturb its breeding birds, which include sedge and reed warblers.

Little grebes nest in the reeds. Kingfishers and sparrowhawks are here and in the winter snipe and water rail too. Cetti's warbler can sometimes be heard singing upstream.






